
# UBT TRACKFEST 2017 April 28 - April 30, 2017, Berne, NY



United Blood Trackers is holding a three day Blood Tracking Workshop on April 28-30, 2017 at Switzkill Farm, Berne, NY, about 50 minutes from Albany, NY. This workshop is for both beginner and advanced handlers, as well as anyone else interested in learning more about the use of tracking dogs for the recovery of wounded big game. Saturday's Hit Site Evaluation Seminar will be of great value to any hunter, not only to tracking dog handlers.

United Blood Trackers will offer evaluations of tracking dogs at UBT-I, UBT-II and UBT III levels on **Friday, April 28, 2017**. To sign up and for more information about evaluation requirements please go to our website <u>www.unitedbloodtrackers.org</u>. If you would like to enter a dog in any of the offered tests, pre-registration is required, and this year you can register online.

On Saturday, April 29, we will be holding the popular Hit Site Evaluation Seminar. This seminar, with the use of a roadkill deer, will focus on determining where you have hit the deer, reading sign at the hit site as well as reading sign found along the trail in order to develop the proper strategy for tracking that particular animal with or without a dog. In the afternoon classroom presentations will cover the nature of scent, European search techniques, and how to interview hunters before taking a call. Demonstrations in the field will address specific training problems.

On Sunday, April 30, we will have presentations on the handler's relationship with a tracking dog, equipment, techniques for putting down a live wounded deer, GPS use, early conditioning of tracking dogs. This will be followed by talks on tracking game species other than deer, breeding working dogs with emphasis on dachshunds, and addressing problems in training and tracking. There will be a panel discussion on audience submitted questions from three different points of view - European, Southern States and Northern States. The final session will be on outreach, publicizing tracking and attracting new handlers to the sport. Demos in the field will be focused on reading a tracking dog and improving handling skills.

## DIRECTIONS to Switzkill Farm, 198 Game Farm Rd, Berne, from Quality Inn, 160 Holiday Way, Schoharie, NY, 12157

- Head northeast toward NY-30A S for 351 ft
- Turn right onto NY-30A S and follow for 2 miles
- Turn left onto NY-443 E and follow for 9.1 mi
- Turn right onto Switzkill Rd and follow for 3.7 mi
- Turn left onto Game Farm Rd and follow the signs for 1 mile.

### **DIRECTIONS to Switzkill Farm from** • Motel #2 (Super 8 in Cobleskill) Start out going east on E Main St/NY-7/ NY-145 toward Forester Rd. Continue to follow • NY-7/NY-145 for 2.35 miles Turn right onto State Route 145/NY-145. • Continue to follow NY-145. • Merge onto I-88 E via the ramp on the left toward Albany. Continue for 5.53 miles • Take the NY-30A exit, EXIT 23, toward NY-7/NY-30/Schoharie/Central Bridge. • Turn right onto State Route 30A/NY-30A. • If you reach I-88 E you've gone about 0.2 • miles too far • State Route 30A/NY-30A becomes State • Route 30/NY-30. Continue for 1.5 miles Turn left onto State Route 443/NY-443 and • follow for 9.1 miles • Turn right onto Switzkill Rd/County Hwy-1 and continue for 2 miles. • • Keep left to stay on Switzkill Rd/County Hwy-1 for 1.6 miles. • Turn left onto Game Farm Rd (Portions unpaved). Game Farm Rd is 0.7 miles past • Rowe Ln. • If you reach Furman Ln you've gone about 0.4 miles too far • Then follow signs for 1.04 miles.
