Trackfest Highlights

Trackfest 2018 was a rousing success!

"You Are Your Dog's Medic," presented by Dr. Bryan Wright was a popular part of the workshop. This presentation on canine first aid, the notebook materials and corresponding videos was aimed at equipping trackers with a "field" kit and a "truck" kit to deal with emergencies in the field.

I'm posting an update on my journey assembling a first aid kit for tracking as per Dr Bryan's presentation at Trackfest in hopes that others who are working to-



ward the same goal will perhaps share their findings as well. The pic shows the field kit and contents. The closed case contains all the contents-so, yes, it will fit!

Observations:

1) if you are going to carry the kit outside your pack/ gear, you need a good strong case, that is as small as possible. These are not cheap, but required (in my opinion) for what we put them through. This case was 40% of total cost.

2) Total cost for the pictured setup was just shy of \$60.

Note: I plan to add a scalpel and a couple of tampons.

3) I definitely need more practice in actually using the kit for various treatments. One of my favorite quotes from the Trackfest presentation, "if you don't know where the kit is, what's in it, and how to use it, it's not going to help much."

The Trackfest "Long Drive Award" had to go to John and Tara from Calgary, Alberta. These folks pulled their camping trailer 36 hours to spend a week in OK, braving snow and ice in the early part of their journey. The snow was replaced by warm temps and lots of wind, and Tara's pup, Alice, passed UBT I. Rumor has it that the couple loved Trackfest, and are already looking forward to the event in 2019. There was a story going around about some diabolical judges laying tracks filled with thorns and ticks, and even one report of an elderly judge laying a track up a cliff, but these reports have not yet been confirmed!!!
